- The Anthropology-Sociology Department will accept senior high school graduates of HUMSS strand under the Academic track.
- Non-HUMSS senior high graduates will be admitted to the program provided that the following conditions will be met during the prescribed period or semesters.
 - In-coming non-HUMSS students are required to get a grade of 2.0 or higher in all subjects that are categorized as humanities (CHS 1 n 2) and social sciences (e.g.)
 - If the student fails to get a grade of 2.0 in any of the subjects categorized under HUMSS during the first semester s/he needs to retake the subject.
 - If the student still fails to get a grade of 2.0 after retaking; then s/he will be advised to shift to another program.
